What is a "JI" / "JIT"?

JI – Junior Instructor: A paid staff member aged between 16 and 21; or a paid staff member aged 15 who has volunteered the previous year as a JIT and who has demonstrated good behavior and good work performance. A JI will work all week with sailing classes during the day. Some may have other duties depending on their qualifications. They should be able to demonstrate their sailing knowledge and skill to the satisfaction of the Camp Director. Interviews may be required.

JIT – Junior Instructor in Training: A camp volunteer aged between 15 and 18; or a camp volunteer who has completed 9th Grade. All JITS will have attended Stockton Sail Camp as Junior Sailors for at least two years and will have demonstrated good behavior, good attitude and good sportsmanship. A JIT volunteer commits to work all week, helping with sailing classes and setting a good example for the Campers. Applicants should be able to demonstrate their sailing knowledge and skill to the satisfaction of the Camp Director. Interviews may be required. With good job performance, a JIT will be eligible to apply to be a JI at next year's Sail Camp.

What you get

You will get all your meals free. Also, with satisfactory job performance we will give you references for other jobs, and you will be eligible to

apply again next year.

Camping

JI / JIT's will camp in tents in an area near the Junior Sailors, but separate from them. Your camp area will be split by gender with the JI/JIT coordinator's tent between the two sides. Please bring your own tent or plan to share with other JI / JIT's of the same gender. If multi-person tents create a problem with lack of sleep or after hours noise, you may be split up. You may want to bring your own tent.

Conduct

You must abide by **all** the regular camp rules. When around campers, you are expected to be good role models and mentors. If you have problems or complaints, bring them to the appropriate adult, out of view and hearing of the campers. We would like you to display a great attitude for the Campers. You are examples of the best our program produces. The campers are all looking up to you!

Land Activities

JI / JIT's may have some different afternoon and evening activity opportunities. Parents should be aware that we may transport them off site. We want you to have fun, but we also are responsible for your health and safety. The Sail Camp Staff wants to work together with you to make this a great time for all.

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JI / JIT's Dress Code

This is for **EVERYONE**. While at camp we recommend a very basic dress code: casual, comfortable, washable. Dress for the temperature – it can get hot. **No bare feet in camp or on the docks.** You must wear shoes, sandals, flip flops, whatever, at all times. You must have sun screen, it is absolutely required every day! Common decency and health codes require that both genders wear a shirt at meals. **Girls – No Bikini Tops/swimsuits; Boys – No bare chests; when food is present.**

Sailing Resume

Include your sailing resume (sailing background) with your application. This should be a typed page where you tell us about your sailing experience. Include things like: sailing classes or clinics that you have attended, sailing awards (Sportsmanship, RYC Jacket, etc.), trophies you have won, major regattas that you have attended, race committee experience, crew experience & class of boats you have sailed, etc. Tell us about any current certifications that you have that are applicable to Sail Camp, such as First Aid, CPR, Lifeguard, US Sailing Instructor Certificate. You can include previous experience teaching younger kids, working at camps, or what ever you think is relevant. Sell yourself! This is a great opportunity to practice for future job applications.

Sign-in and Family BBQ

JI's and JIT's must check in and be available to assist at 12:00 PM Sunday. Camper sign-in will start at 4:00 PM Sunday afternoon, followed at 5:00 PM by a family BBQ. Campers & Staff are free - all others will be approximately \$10.00 each. A family orientation and introduction of camp staff will be held after the BBQ at 6:00 PM (all times are approximate). Families are urged to attend with their Junior, and if needed, help them set up their tent and get settled. JI/JIT's must be on-site, checked-in and presentable prior to Camper orientation.

Check-out, Awards and Family Buffet

The Camp ends following the awards buffet on Saturday afternoon. Parents are asked to arrive by

11 a.m. to disassemble the tents, load the boats, and help ensure that the facility is left in immaculate condition. The Clinic cannot and will not assume responsibility for Junior Sailors after Noon on Saturday.

The Awards buffet starts at Noon. Enrolled Juniors Campers and staff are free; all others will pay approximately \$10.00.

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Sail Camp Equipment Check List:

Each of the items below marked with a "★" is considered *mandatory*:

Mark everything with your name: Boat parts, clothes, camping gear, EVERYTHING!

Sailing Instruction Equipment

- ★ Sailing clothes – wet suits and spray suits are usually not necessary but you may want to pack them, just in case. Definitely bring clothes and shoes that can get wet.
- Waterproof watch with a count-down timer (for intermediates and advanced racers).
- Pen, pencil, clipboard or note pad.
- Fun stuff for your class? Water gun (to keep them cool, of course!), sponges, bag of hard candy, plastic bottle balers. Use your imagination, have fun with your class. 10-15 foot long painter suitable for towing.

Mandatory Safety Items

- ★ **Water bottle** (EXTREMELY important in the heat to protect yourself from dehydration)
- ★ **Sun Screen** Lotion (ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY, sailors will be **REQUIRED** to apply lotion every morning and again after lunch! Consider this a safety item for your near term comfort [sunburn prevention] and long term health.
- ★ **Hat and sunglasses**, with retainer straps. (ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY, these are the sun screen for your eyeballs!)
- ★ **Life jacket**, USCG approved, that fits properly.

Camping and Personal Items

- ★ Tent and sleeping bag (sleeping mat/pad & pillow optional)
- ★ Sufficient clothing for a week (Expect hot, and very hot temperatures but include long pants and a sweatshirt for occasional chilly weather)
- ★ Shoes for land and water - (Sneakers, sandals, water shoes)
- ★ Swimming suit
- ★ Shower and beach towels
- ★ Personal items (tooth brush, hair brush/comb, shampoo, soap, wash cloth, etc.)
- Flashlight (you might need to help your counselor find his/her way to the bathroom in the middle of the night!)
- Insect repellent
- You may want to bring some money in case there is an opportunity to go into town with the other JI / JIT's for a movie or other activity. \$20 recommended.
- ★ Good attitude with a desire to teach and have FUN!

Do NOT bring

- ★ No lighters, matches or flames of any kind. Sailors who need to burn the ends of lines can ask instructors for help. JI/JIT's may burn line ends with adult supervision.
- ★ No skateboards, skates, scooters, bikes, and boom boxes. Please leave these home.

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CAMP RULES

SSC / RYC / SCYC Junior Sail Camp

A single violation of the following rules, numbers 1, 2, or 3 are grounds for IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL & EXPULSION from the camp!

1. No possession or use of any substance containing alcohol, tobacco, or any controlled substance, except medicine prescribed by a physician specifically for the Junior's use. (Said use and need shall be specified in the medical information section of the application.)
2. No stealing. (Borrowing without the express knowledge and consent of the owner may be considered stealing.)
3. No leaving the camp grounds with out staff permission.

Repeated breaking of the following rules will result in disqualification from competition and may result in dismissal and expulsion from the camp.

4. Life jackets must be worn at all times while in boats or on docks.
5. Shoes must be worn at all times around the camp and **on the docks**.
6. Curfew / Lights-out must be observed (times and conditions will be announced).
7. Use of abusive language or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated.
8. Juniors are expected to carry out instructions as required for the orderly conduct of the clinic as assigned by instructors, camp staff, or its organizers, in a timely and productive manner.
9. Behavior deemed disruptive or unsafe will not be tolerated.
10. Juniors must abide by the posted rules of the host club.
11. No swimming except as part of scheduled drills, training or activities authorized by the camp staff.
12. All docks other than "A" dock are off limits to Juniors without staff permission.
13. All Juniors will sleep in the designated camp area. No juniors will be allowed to sleep on boats in the harbor.
14. No matches, lighters, or flames of any kind. Juniors needing to burn lines can ask instructors for help.
15. Common decency and health codes require that both genders wear a shirt at meals. Girls - No Bikini Tops, Boys - No Bare Chests, when food is present.

For Adults:

This Junior event has been designated as a "DRY" event by joint consensus of the sponsoring club's Boards of Directors. All adults are expected to refrain from the consumption of alcoholic beverages and be "dry" while in attendance at this event, whether visiting or acting in a staff or volunteer capacity.

For JI / JIT's:

1. You are expected to cheerfully follow all of the above camp rules, be a Role Model and show good behavior and good attitude towards the Campers, staff and volunteers.
2. You are expected to be kind, helpful, positive, respectful and supportive of the campers, camp staff and parent volunteers.
3. During your designated work hours, you are expected to focus all of your attention on your assigned task. During your free time, you must continue to follow the camp rules and set a good example, especially in the presence of Campers.
4. You must check-in with your designated coordinator for permission to leave the normal Club House Area.
5. JI / JIT's are not allowed in the Camper's Tent Area, unless requested by an adult staff member.
